

This Tract of Land Beginning at a post standing by a marked white oak about half a mile to the south West Ward of a Logghouse at a place Called Hockagonda then East seven hundred and sixty eight perches by vacant Land to a black oak marked for a corner then North two hundred and forty perches by vacant Land to a balance of description lost or mislaid.
