



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the 14th day of March anno Dom. 1733. Issuued on the Sixth day of January 1737 to Thomas Gardner & Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Paxtang in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Locas Tree, thence North 28° Degrees East 354 perches to a post, thence North 44° Degrees West 145 perches to a post, thence South 42° Degrees West 345 perches to a White Walnut Standing by the River Susquehanna thence down the said River 234 perches to the place of beginning containing 380 Acres and the Allowance of Six P. Cent for Roads and high Ways.

Let not this be accepted till the lines be further ascertained by E. Snout for he says he finds by a survey the lines are longer than here described.
