By Virtue of a Warrant from the Propriet^{es} dated the 25th day of July A.D. 1733.
Surveyed on the 25th day of July 1734 to John Yoder Jun^r. a Tract of Land Situate in the
County of Philad^s. Beginning at a post being corner of his other Land thence by Vacant Land
South East fifty nine perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South West one hundred and
ninety six perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North West two hundred & ten perches to a post
thence along a Road leading to Philad^s North Twenty Degrees East one hundred & thirty two
perches to a post thence by Land of Gabriel Boer South East one hundred and one perches to
a post in the line of q. s. John Yoder's other Land thence by the same South West
Ninety perches to a post thence by the same South East one hundred & ten perches to a
White Oak thence by the same North East one hundred & fifty four perches to the
place of Beginning containing one hundred & fifty acres with usual allowance.
