



In Pursuance of a Warr. dated the 27th Day of September 1760, I have Surveyed ^{on the 17th of October 1760.} to Joseph Graisburgh a certain Lot of Ground Situate in the City of Philadelphia between High Street and Chestnut Street on the Bank of Delaware, Being the Bank part of a Bank & Water Lot formerly granted to Philip Pitchards containing in Breadth 27 feet and in length 45 feet. Bounded westward by Delaware Front Street, Northward by Ground in the Tenure of Elizabeth Miller Widow, Eastward by Delaware Street formerly called King Street and Southward by a Lot of Ground in the Tenure ~~Pantuf~~ of Mary Penrose, Widow.
