I do certify that at the time of surveying the above described piece of land there appeared to be a quantity of s^d land Cleared and fenced and a crop of Indian Corn growing thereon And also a Cabin on s^d land fit for the habitation of man but no family living in s^d Cabin &c.

Note there was a family living in s^d Cabin some short time before I surveyed it as Wm Woods has another farm joining s^d above described land and this being a small piece he rented both to one person and is drawing rent for the above piece of land and it is still in a State of Cultivation
