



The shaded lines in the above diagram represent a Survey made to James Brown on the 1<sup>st</sup> of June 1775 By warrant of the 25<sup>th</sup> of July 1773 Situate on a branch of the Allegheny about 4 miles N.W. of a path leading from the two licks to Peholand's camp including the mouth of a run & a Spring running into Said Creek in Westmoreland County This Survey is found to be on Little Maoblog about 4 miles below the Peholand path which was at the time the warrant issued and at the time the Survey was made within the Indian Territory several miles north of the purchase of 1768 Situate in Mahoning Township Indiana County -

The land is now claimed under a warrant issued to Hermon Veroy and Jan Binklean the 13<sup>th</sup> of December 1792 No 3138 and surveyed thereon the 18<sup>th</sup> of August 1794 the Survey of which is represented by the dotted lines in the above diagram - The Survey of James Brown includes the farm of the widow Jane Wadding who claims under the title of Hermon Veroy & Jan Binklean - Ascertained the above interference on the 17<sup>th</sup> of May 1828 In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of location or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by authority from the Board of property.
