



In pursuance of a Warrant dated the nineteenth day of October 1762, Surveyed
for Richard Tea a certain Tract of Land situate in Germanak Township below Jacks Mtn.
now in the County of Cuyahoga, Beginning at a white oak and from thence extending by
other Land of the said Richard Tea the three Courses and distances following vizt: South 26
degrees West 104 perches to a white oak, South 18 degrees West 143 perches to a maple, and South
68 degrees West 100 perches to a white oak standing on the bank of Juniper River thence
westerly North 30 Degrees West 20 perches to a post a corner of James Ross's land
thence ~~by~~ ^{to} the same North 27° East 169 perches to a white oak, thence North 47° West
50 perches to 032.08^{ft}, thence by Vacant Land North 67° East 166 perches to the place of
Beginning Containing one hundred and four Acres and three quarters of an Acre
and the usual allowance of six acres for Roads &c.
