



Situate on one of the head branches of Roundlick run, a branch of Juniper; and on one of the head branches of Wolf's camp run, a branch of Wills creek; including a very old improvement - On both sides of the great road leading from Somerset to Bedford and surveyed the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May 1792 by George Woods Esq. Then D.S. in pursuance of a Warrant granted to David O'Henshaw dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of Sept<sup>r</sup> 1784; as appears by the officially certified draught of John McClean Esq D.S. dated 30<sup>th</sup> Novr. 1811, accompanied by his explanatory note, stating that the interference of James Daily's and John McChure's surveys therewith, as represented by the dotted line; being 52 1/2% (leaving only 42 1/2% clear of dispute) happened by inaccuracy in surveying the latter
