By Virtue of an Order from Jacob Taylor Tome Directed
bearing date July the 18th 1722 to Way out to Joseph
Kirkbird on his order the Quantity of five hundred ac-
res of land in Buck County now lies may Setly sie that I
have Surveyed to John Trickey one hundred acres of the
same which he hath Sold and it never yet Retorned the
other so wet being Sold to Joseph Worth and Retorned
Sometime ago Miss Beginning at a Corner Stone by a
marked white oak then South one hundred and
sixty peaches to a pos(ble) and stones then West by James
Greens on hundred and six peaches to a small white Oak
then North one hundred and Sixty peaches by vacant
land to a post then East one hundred and six peach-
es by vacant land to the place of beginning Contain-
ing one hundred and six acres the Six acre being as
usual allowance for Roads and highways lying in Bu-
cks County beyond the Great Swallow upon the head bra-
nch of Skoos Creek given under my hand the 29 day
of the first month in March 1737 John Chapman
Skoos Creek
