



In pursuance of a Warrant for 400 Acres of land dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 1811. Was Surveyed on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 1811 for John Davis Esq. of Chester County, assignee of John Bangly; the above described tract of land, containing 409 Acres and 71 perches, and allowance of Six Per Cent for Roads &c. Situate in the Township of Cussewago, and County of Crawford. John Bangly was actually residing on the land at the time of making the Survey.

On the land surveyed on the warrant in the name of John Davis, there were a cabin and other out buildings - at least 20 acres cleared (from appearance) John Bangly was living on the land with his family. The premises appeared to be regularly fenced, and in tolerably good tenable order.
