



Subdivide on the waters of Little Sandy Creek adjoining the State line. And Surveyed the 4th day of December 1815, in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 14th day of November 1787. & as well in consequence of a decree of the Honorable Board of Property dated the 14th day of February 1787. Note. The dotted lines represent Robert Moore's tract as it interferes with Cushman, there are two improvements on said tract No. J.B., A represents the improvement or first settlement made by Isaac Cushman there are about ninety acres of cleared land under a good fence, a small cabin and a cabin roofed both about two hundred bearing fruit-trees, and family now residing on the premises. The improvements at B made "since the execution of Moore's Warrant, by Isaac Cushman has about twenty acres cleared & under good fence a Cabin and other small buildings, a hewed log house not yet roofed & about fifty bearing fruit-trees, but no family resides thereon at present
