



A Draught of a tract of Land called Crab-Free-Bottom situate on the South side of the West Branch of Susquehanna River about three miles below a remarkable semicircular group of young Walnuts growing on the North side of said River and about ten miles above Chingleclamouche, adjoining and below Land surveyed for Humphrey Williams in Cumberland County. Containing Three hundred and Twenty seven acres and three quarters and the usual allowance of Six p. Cent for Roads. &c. Surveyed 8th July 1769 for George Fush in pursuance of an order No 3000. Dated 8th April 1769.
