

March 18th. 1822. In pursuance of a Warrant (granted to Robert Clark) dated the 14th day of March A.D. 1822. Surveyed for him an Island in the river Susquehanna called Elba, in the Township of Halifax and County of Dauphin. Opposite to Durcans Big Island, and opposite to land of Marcus Martin on the Dauphin Shore near Newbuckers Island on meside & near Clarks Island at the Upper point and found it to contain one acre & fifty nine perches strict measure
