In pursuance of an order from Jacob Taylor Surveyor General to me directed dated January 28<sup>th</sup> 1726 to me Directed, Requiring me to survey and lay out unto, John and Isaac Leach Three hundred and seventy five acres of land Surveyed and laid out to John Leach and Isaac Leach aforesaid this 3 day of February 1726 the following Tract of Land Beginning at a Red Oak tree being and standing in the Corner of Edward Shippen's land, thence extending by a line of marked trees North East 329 perches to a small White Oak hence by a line of marked trees 210 perches to a small Spanish oak sapling thence by a line of marked trees 180 perches to a white oak tree in the line of Daniel Barkers land thence by said Barkers land N.W 50 perches to a hickory stump thence by the said Barkers land S.W 100 perches to a post thence by the aforesaid Shippen's land N.W one hundred sixty perches to the first mentioned place of Beginning containing Three hundred seventy five acres - and six acres to y<sup>e</sup> hundred added for Allowance etc
