



The above tract of Land situate in Lykens in the County of Chester, was by Warrant of the 20<sup>th</sup> of December 1701. Resurveyed for Thomas Jones & Company for 635 acres, but upon a late Resurvey or Examination of the lines thereof, it is found to contain 8 acres ~~more~~ and a roome of six acres ~~P C.~~ more, which 8 acres Barrowance, Robert Jones, and James Paul who claim under Robert Jones dec'd, desire may be confirmed to them in Right, and as part of a Society warrant of the 18<sup>th</sup> of November 1724<sup>a</sup> to the said Robert Jones dec'd in his life time for 300 acres, who sold 200 acres of the said 300 acres, to one William Murray, and the remaining 100 acres now vested in them, yet remains untaken up as it is said Resurveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1747.
