Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract of land by them as Surveyor late D.S. under George Stevenson late D.S. on the 8th day of April A.D. 1779. and now at the request of James Starr the present owner, the above has been calculated examined &c. and returned for confirmation the 1st day of January A.D. 1811.
