



Situated on the Waters of Georges but near the Waters of Deadstone ^{Creek} partly on the dividing ridge and on the Road that leads from the Gap of the Mountain to Cheat River in George Township Fayette County and surveyed the 23^d Day of December 1785 in consequence of the following Voucher -

Monongalia County April 14th 1780

Empson Brownfield Produced a Certificate from the Commissioners of Monongalia Virginia and Ohio for 400 acres of Land on the Waters of Dead Stone Creek to include his Settlement made in 1770 also a right in Preemption of 1000 acres Dated the 1st of December 1779.
