



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Springfield Manor in the County of Chester, now in the Possession of the Heirs of Francis Long Beginning at a marked Maple standing on the East side of Brandywine Creek and from thence extending along the line of the said Manor North 82 Degrees and a half East 170 perches to a stone. Thence by James Hoskyn's Land North 14 Degrees East 230 perches to a marked black oak, thence by Andrew Wilson's Land South 88^o West 154 perches to a marked Spanish Oak. thence by Land of Samuel Muckledorff and Vacant Land South 38 Degrees West 125 perches to Brandywine Creek, thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred and forty Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres P Cent for Roads &c Surveyed the 20th day of October 1753 by Direction of the Honourable the Proprietaries ~
