



A Draught of a Tract of land Situate in Dover Township
in the County of York Surveyed the 8th Day of April 1793 To Sophia
Ertel in Pursuance of a Warrant to her Dated the 5th Day of March
1793 Containing for Two Acres and the usual Allowance of
six Acres P.C. for Roads &c John Forsyth U.S.
Casper Smith Procured a warrant for what is within the
Dotted lines Dated the 26th day of Feb 1793 which was
executed but when the Survey of the Whole of the land that
he held amounted to no more than 4 2 a & $\frac{1}{2}$ and that the piece
Surveyed for Casper Smith would take almost all the timber
they agreed to dismiss the Caveat and give up the whole
to the Widow Ertel. Afterwards Smith Bought the Whole
of the land, and Ertel Dismissed the Caveat this is the
Best information I have of the case
