

Edward Bonsall

A draught of a tract of land called the Elk Pasture (being part of a large tract of the same name situated on the head of Otter Creek or Conemough between the North and East branches thereof about four miles above the Forks & about one mile N.E. from the great Elk Lick adjoining land of Edward Bonsall and William Robinson in Frankstown township in the County of Bedford containing two hundred and ninety nine acres & the usual allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent for roads &c. surveyed the 23d day of September 1773 by virtue of a warrant dated the 23d day of July in the same year for William Sheed by
