



By Virtue of a Warr^t from the Hon^{ble} Proprietary's Dated the first Day of December
 anno^r Dom^r 1739/1755. There is Survey'd unto Robert Dunning in Lancaster County on
 the West Side Susquehannah River. One Thousand Acres of Land in two pieces
 wth allowl. One of which Begins at a Locust Post. Thence North Eighty nine Degrees
 Westerly Two hundred pches to a Hickery. Thence North sixty Degrees westerly Eighty
 six pches to a Hickery. Thence South Thirty five Degrees Westerly Three hundred
 and forty pches to a Hickery. Thence South fifty five Degrees Easterly one hun-
 dred and Twenty pches to a Hickery. Thence East five hundred and Thirty pches
 to a white oak. Thence North one hundred and forty six pches to a Black oak. Thence
 North forty six Degrees westerly Two hundred and Twenty three pches to the place
 of Beginning. The other piece Begins at a white oak by Dunning's run Thence
 North Seventy Eight Degrees Westerly Twenty five pches to a white oak. North Eight
 Degrees west fifty four pches to a white oak. North Thirteen Degrees Easterly one
 hundred and twenty pches to a white oak. North Three Degrees Easterly one hun-
 dred and Seventy seven pches to a white oak. North Twenty Eight Degrees Easterly
 Eighty pches to a Hickery. South East by East Twenty two pches to a white oak. South
 Ten Degrees westerly Three hundred and forty nine pches to a white oak. South
 one Degree Easterly Sixty six pches to the place of Beginning.
