


Courses and Distances from the

- S. 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 77 perches
- S. 73° E. 56.2 perches
- S. 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 10 perches
- S. 57° E. 124.5 perches
to a post No. 525

Note the River Courses as
above in this Survey were
run on the Top of the River
Bank and the Distances
noted falling off from the
Edge of the Bank which
to account for there is
to be added to the Quantity
contained within the Courses
as set down 3 Acres accounting
the whole to the Edge of the Bank.
