Situate in Elizabeth Township Allegany County and Surveyed the 3^d day of April 1789. In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 10th day of July 1786

To Daniel Brodhead Esquire. & Alexander McLean Deputy Surveyor General.

Note, the North End of this Tract is Controverted by John Reardon who has procured a Warrant for 50^a dated 3^d September 1790. And alledges that this Warrant is not laid on the Land for which it was designed. I believe it is so in part, but as it joins George Shields one of the persons named in the Warrant & no other Warrant to hinder it appears but Reasonable at that time to satisfy the Warrant but as Reardon has applied & procured a Warrant & urged the Survey to be made. I have gratified him therein & send draughts as usual prepared for whatever the Event may be, at the same time would wish that patent may not be Granted to either until the parties are heard by the Honorable Board. Reardon will forward Regular Caveat the first opportunity. A. McLean
