By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the — day of January anno Dom. 1734 I have laid out on the 1st day of February in the year above-said unto George Gray of the Township ⁱⁿ Kingess in the County of Philadelp ^{on} or large Lots of Ground within 1 1/2 miles of Philadelphia City; One of wh ^{ch} is bounded on the South by High Street & extends by the said Street No ^{to} by five degrees West. Six hundred ^{ft} feet to Schuylkil River. Thence by said River North twenty one degrees ²² est. Six hundred sixty two feet, thence by ^{the} Berry Street South seventy five degrees East six hundred feet to Schuylkil Front st street. thence ^{the} st street South fifteen degrees West six hundred & sixty feet to the place of Beginning Containing nine acres & seventy five perches. The st or Lot is bounded on the North by ^{the} st Street & extends by the said Street ^{to} the th Street South fifty five degrees East from ^{the} st th Street Six hundred & fifty feet thence by the said Front Street South fifteen degrees West four hundred eighty four feet to ^{the} th Street. thence by the th Street North seventy five degrees West Seven hundred & ten feet to the th River. thence by the same North twenty one degrees East four hundred eighty five feet & a half to the place of Beginning. Containing ^{one} acre & eighty nine perches. — Returned into the Secretarys ^{office} the fourth day of the ^{one} month of January ^{one} thousand seven hundred and thirty four. — R.
