

Started from a Stake East corner between S. 27 E. and the West Bank of Lacananna Creek.

Thence N. 54 W. - a cultivated field of Daniel Taylor containing about 1 acre less perches from my line to L. 14. x small stream pt. L. 109 x main road leading up Lacananna 15.8 Taylors brush fence about  $\frac{1}{8}$  of an acre partially cleared to L. 190 x small stream pt. L. 198 x another pt. L. 316 x mill creek pt. L. 320 to Elzey Taylors improvement his house denoted by Peter H. Moore's R. about an acre cleared to L. 556 x St. Johns Brook pt. L. 691.5 the distance for Sarah Delany, no timber, could not find her line, made a pine corner - Memo. - Sarah Delany does not come within the provisions of the Compromising Act, being surveyed in 1789.

Thence by land surveyed for Sarah Delany S. 142. 14. 5. W. 79 made stake corner


Thence by R. 1 and including land released (under Act of 14<sup>th</sup> Ap<sup>t</sup> 1799) by Sam'l Meredith S. 54. 6. 25 x St. Johns Brook pt. L. 134 to improved land of John P. Feltz about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre imp'd to S. 3811 x Mill brook pt. L. 404.5 made a stake corner in N. E. line of land surveyed for J. H. Henderson and not released to Commonwealth. Surveyed in 1789.

Thence by S. Hendersons land S. 67. 45. E. including land surveyed by Sam'l Meredith and released to Commonwealth to vacant land to L. 62 spring pt. R. and in improved land of Feltz, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre to L. 106.7 to land released by James Moore - made a stake by main road.

Thence by S. Moore's land S. 146. 14. 5. W. being also by said Henderson's land not released as afo're stake, and including about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre of s'd Feltz's land who has cleared over the line, residing on Lot No. 1.

Thence S. 60° 45' W. by said Henderson's land 2 p<sup>r</sup> to Stake in the line between lots No 1 and two

Thence by lot No 1, including land released by Sam'l Meredith S. 54. 6. 25. 5 to Lacawanna and thence up it as per margin

Draft of a tract of land containing the actual settlement and improvement of Daniel Taylor situated in the certified township of Providence one of the 17 townships in Luzerne County being part of Lot No 2 in said Township. Containing two hundred and ninety one acres and seventy six perches and the usual allowance of six per cent. for Roads &c. Surveyed July 18<sup>th</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of July 1822 for William Ross in pursuance of a warrant dated March 3<sup>d</sup> 1819.

N. B. A. Represents the house and about 120 perches of cleared land occupied by Daniel Taylor who has resided in it since early in February 1818. B. - represents another cleared field of s'd Taylor containing about four acres. The house has been occupied occasionally, and with intermissions, prior to Taylor's living in it as far as can learn since 1806.

The part shaded in yellow represents part of two tracts originally surveyed for and released by Sam'l Meredith under the provisions of the Compromising Act. The part shaded in orange represents part of land surveyed for and released by James Moore as afo're. The part shaded in red represents part of land surveyed for J. H. Henderson, and not within the provisions of the afo're Act, being surveyed in 1789, and is not included in this Survey.
