NB this is the Land in dispute between Mr. Germill and Mr. Smith when I Surveyed the Land  
Mr. Smith thought he had the right to it and included a great deal of his improvements and all David Smiths in the part marked A and on the  
part marked B Francis Smith had made a small Improvement which however were all included in the one Survey at that time and not the  
least dispute about as I heard, but Mr. Smith when he understood what quantity was in the Survey more than the Warrant was for requested me  
not to return it until I heard further from him for he intended he said to get an additional Warrant as soon as the Office opened and in that  
situation it lay until the dispute arose more than a year after
