And that part where the letter B is placed in the above draught represents part of a larger Tract of Land surveyed by the said George Stevenson late D.S. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1756, for Abraham Dicks in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1754. And that part where the letter C is placed being part of a larger Tract surveyed on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1753, by George Stevenson late D.S. for John Morningstar and John Smith In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1752. And now Surveyed and laid off as above set forth at the Particular request of Tempest Tucker the Present Owner on the sixth & seventh days of April anno Domini 1804.
