



I connected Draft of Several Tracts of Land. Situate in Union and Bethel townships Lebanon County: The first thereof situate in Union township. Containing One hundred and Thirty Acres & 115 perches & allowance of 6 per cent for Roads &c Surveyed May 15th 1865 for Christian Minnick. The second thereof, being part of same original Tract of Land, Situate in Union township aforesaid. Containing Seventy two acres & 120 perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c Surveyed May 16th 1865 for Daniel Daubert; The third thereof, Situate in Bethel township Lebanon County. Containing Seventy five Acres & 15 perches & allowance &c. Being parts of Two tracts of Land, the one of 204 acres & 2 perches; the other of 103 acres & 80 perches. Surveyed in pursuance of Application No. 1400. of 10<sup>th</sup> April 1766. and Re-surveyed Nov. 14<sup>th</sup> 1793. The fourth thereof containing Four acres & 139 perches & allowance being part of 31 acres & 130 perches. Surveyed to William Poor, on application No. 555. Situate in Bethel township aforesaid. and the fifth thereof being the same which George W. Eckert and wife conveyed to said Daniel Daubert as part of a larger tract. Surveyed severally for said Daniel Daubert
