



A Return of Several Lots of Land lying in Bristol surveyed to Thomas Marriot being lately purchased from Robert Cobbert. The first Lot beginning at a post by Radcliff Street at the Corner of the Thomas Marriot's From thence running by the 1<sup>st</sup> Lot North West six perches & three fourths of a perch to a Post. Then again by the 1<sup>st</sup> Marriots Lot E 27<sup>deg</sup> N three perches to a Post at David Calmer's corner. Then by the 1<sup>st</sup> Palmers Line South East six perches & three fourths to a post at the 1<sup>st</sup> Radcliff Street. Then by the 1<sup>st</sup> Street W. 27<sup>deg</sup> S three perches to the beginning. The next Lot begins at a post from thence running North West 6 3/4 perches. Then by Walnut Street South East thirteen perches. Then West 27<sup>deg</sup> South 7 1/2 perches to a Post at Jos. Chapmans & David Calmer's. The next Lot begins at a post by Delaware River at Thomas Stackhouse's corner. From there extending by the 1<sup>st</sup> Stackhouse's Line North 27<sup>deg</sup> West 20 perches to a hickory supposed in the middle of Cedar Street. Then West 27<sup>deg</sup> South 14 perches to a Small White Oak. Then by Samuel Carpenter's land North 27<sup>deg</sup> West twenty seven perches & a half to a Post by a Hickory at the 1<sup>st</sup> Stackhouse's corner. Then by the 1<sup>st</sup> Stackhouse's Land East 27<sup>deg</sup> North 23 1/4 perches to a Post. Then by 1<sup>st</sup> Carpenter's Land South 27<sup>deg</sup> East 27 1/2 perches to a Post in Cedar Street above 1<sup>st</sup> Street West 27<sup>deg</sup> South fifteen perches & a quarter of a perch to a Post by a Black oak. Then South 27<sup>deg</sup> East 20 perches to a Pine tree by the 1<sup>st</sup> River. Then down the same perches to the beginning the last Lot containing four acres & a half laid out by Resurvey the 21<sup>st</sup> of the first month 1717/8.
