



By virtue of two severall Warr<sup>ts</sup> from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>rs</sup> to me directed bearing date the 21<sup>st</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> days of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1703 to lay out unto Francis Plumsted of London (Purchaser of 2500 acres of Land in this Province) for each Warr<sup>t</sup> the quantity of 500 acres. And by order from the s<sup>d</sup> Comm<sup>rs</sup> to lay <sup>it</sup> in one tract. Surveyed and laid out unto the s<sup>d</sup> Francis Plumsted a Tract of Land in the Township of Plumstead in Bucks County Beginning at a Post by a white oak in Widow Musgreaves line. Thence North West by Henry Childs's land Six hundred and forty perches to a Post. Then by Vacant land North East <sup>250 perches</sup> to a Post and heap of Stones. Then South East by Joseph Paul's and Elizabeth Sands land Six hundred and forty perches to a Post on a Plain at Widow x Musgreaves Corner. Then by s<sup>d</sup> Musgreaves line South West two hundred and fifty perches to the place of beginning Containing one thousand acres Laid <sup>out</sup> the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1704.
