



A Draught of Survey Surveys made for Thomas Wallis on Several Parcels of Land situate on the Branches
of Colerane Creek in Oxford (formerly London) Very Township in the County of Chester

B. Described 135^{ft} his first Survey formerly Return'd on two Warrants both bearing Date the 7th of December 1747.

C. The second Survey 22 1/2^{ft} formerly Return'd in Pursuance of another Warrant of the same Date with the above mentioned.

D. The third Survey 64^{ft} In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date Novem. 30th 1754.

E. The fourth Survey 33 1/2^{ft} In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date the same Day of the last mentioned.

F. The fifth Survey 51 1/2^{ft} & the allowance as usual In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date the 15th August 1755.

G. A Vacancy that remained survey'd for his Son John Wallis who had Improvements thereon & requested the same might be added as there were so many warrants.
