



Province of the Narragansett granted Thomas and Samuel Barnard the 22nd of January
1802 Surveyed unto them One hundred & five acres & three eighths of an acre of land in Falls
Township Bucks county which with the twenty acres now in the possession of Samuel Sutton
that was sold for Day the 11th of August 1784 (in due form of law) to John Carlomakes
125 3/8 Acres the whole of what is called the "Falls common" formerly the "Timber Swamp"
and return the above as the Draft thereof 12 February 1802. N.B. the red lines are agreeable to the survey
made in 1702.
