The above tract of land together with that marked by the dotted lines was surveyed by Simon Snyder Jr. for  
for John Hayes D.S. on the 26<sup>th</sup> December 1828 in virtue of a Warrant to Peter Shaffer Dated the 17<sup>th</sup> Decr.  
1828 for Eight acres but was not returned. I found the lines closed at the Hickory and therefore did not think  
it right to include the land described by the dotted lines in my return although called for by the Warrant.  
It has been cleared about forty years and in possession of Peter Shaffer & his son Geo. W. Shaffer  
ever since. Part of the land in that returned Northerly from the Hickory has been cleared from  
ten to thirty years and also in possession of Peter Shaffer & his son Geo W. Shaffer.

I have given you the facts as clearly as possible that you may be enabled to decide the matter between the parties. I have charged Martin not to take possession of the land until further orders from you which I presume would be settled as soon after I made my return as possible. If any other information is wanting that I can give it will be immediately attended to.
