



A Draught of the Land of David Morton in Falconhook in the Township of Darby in Chester County & Beginning at a post at the Corner of an Orchard Field near the Creek Thence South 84 Degrees East 19 1/2 P. to the Creek of Darby then up by same or by several Courses thereof 127 perches to John Davis's Meadow then North 5 1/2 West by the same along a Ditch 14 1/2 P. to a Stake then North 5 1/2 E. 5 3/4 P. to a post and Rail fence then along the same North 38^d East 13 per. then North 7 3/5 E. East 16 1/2 P. thence North 56 1/2 E. East 12 7/10 P. then North 30^d East 22 7/10 P. then North 5 1/4 E. East 7 6/10 P. to a White Oak tree by a turn of the Creek then up the same 24 P. to a Small Maple thence North 23 degrees West 89 3/4 P. to a small White Oak stump thence South 67 deg West 88 3/4 P. to a Stake then North 26^d West 5 3/4 P. to a Street Gun then South 63 degrees West 29 7/10 P. by Land of Andrew Boon and Andrew Wren 48 1/2 P. to a small Black Oak then South 76^d East 6 1/2 P. Land of Conrad Neithernark 30 perches to y^e corner of a fence then by same along the right of the lane South 7 1/2 West 128 perches to a Stone at y^e corner of Conrad's shop then back to y^e Right along the Cross Lane 10 feet then by y^e s^t Conrad's Land South 5^d West 17 perches to y^e place of Beginning Containing One hundred and twenty acres Surveyed 17 of 3rd 1734.
Since this survey the S.B.C. cut off the above described Tract to Conrad Neithernark being formerly sold & included within a Tract.
