

In answer to a Warrant entered by one Widow Colvin against the acceptance of the Return of a Certain Piece of Land Surveyed to James Patterson in London Valley town^P Chester County:

James Patterson a Warrant for 30^a more or less


Date 19th Februy^r A.D. 1741.

Ditto an Additional Warrant for 20^a more or less.

Date 19th August 1746

John Colvin a Warrant for 20^a am
addition to his other Land Dated June
2^d A.D. 1749

The Chief occasion of Dispute in the Land about A. When James Patterson's first piece B. 40^a was surveyed in December 1741. he would fain have taken that Piece, his place being very poor &c very little Timber on it; But my Father Dissuaded him from it, it appearing to suit John Colvin best. ^{very good timber} But he still Neglecting to get it, (though Persuaded thereto by my Father) & Indeed Refusing it, having an Addition made to his place on y^e other End thereof; All which Patterson seeing, he again sued for it & accordingly applied for a Warrant in the year 1746. Which Lay near 3 years. John Colvin knowing it, yet he never made any Stirr^r to it till the year 1749. when he applied for a warrant, the same never being brought to my hands till after his Death; And when I went to Survey the Land last Spring, I saw & consider'd the case every way, it appears to me most reasonable & least Prejudicial to the Prop^{rs} Land adjoint^r that Patterson should have it. his Place being abundantly the worse & he willing to take near 40^a (which lay between his other Land & that) of Barren & unprofitable land, & there being enough elsewhere adjoining to fill Colvin's warrant; this being the truest Information I am capable to give. I submit it to the Judgment of the Secretarie. Done 22nd 1750. Geo: Churchward
