I did on the 6th 7th 8th 10th 11th Day of September 1764 resurvey the s^d two Tracts of land & incl. otl. such Overplus as was clear of the Lines of the Claimers of adjoining lands & found the same to otl. situate in _____ Township in s^d County of Lancaster Beginning at an Old mark'd otl. Oak Tree standing on the East side of the Gap Mine Run, extending thence by John Liggiott Land East twenty eight perches to another mark'd White Oak Thence South by the Three hundred & three quarters Acre Tract two hundred and twelve perches to a mark'd White Oak as above described - The Otl. Tract Beginning at a White Oak thence extending by the otl. Mine Land South two hundred & five perches to a Spanish Oak thence by land of Nicho otl. Tract North eighty eight degrees East eighty seven perches to a post, &c as above described - Containing in the wh. otl. Seven hundred & eighty Acres & three Quarters & allor otl. of sup^d Ct for Roads &c
