

Surveyed for the legal representatives of the Heirs of John Menor dec'd & to wit. J. W. McJunkins & Elias Davidson. The above described Tract of Land included within the lines bordered with Yellow. Containing three hundred fifty six Acre two perches. 5/10 of a p. & all & being part of a large Tract of land Survey'd March the 1st and June the 15th 1773 by Virtue of two Warrants one granted to John Menoch for 300 Acre of land dated the 2nd of Dec^r 1772 the other granted to Wm Menoch the 26th of May 1773 for 200 Acre adjoining to each other, and returned into the Surveyor Gen^r Office as containing 599 Acre 145 p. Situate in Plum Township, Allegheny County, on the waters of Beaver Creek & Twentil Creek. the External lines of the remaining part of the Tract as represented by the dotted lines contains four hundred eight acres twelve p. 4/10 & all & Making in the original Survey an Overplus of Land of 164 Acre 37 p. 1/10 & All the first Survey as represented was Surveyed & Subdivid. off by the Mutual consent of all the parties interested in the same.
