


The D^rft of a tract of land situate in Fishing Creek Township

Two of the surveys represented above belong to Thos^t Robins and you will readily perceive the cause of the
small Survey, the two surveys being a greater quantity than could be Return'd, those surveys were made by me
at the instance of T Robins, who had Applied for a Patent but was Inform'd that no Return of Survey was made
by Gen^l Montgomery by whom the surveys were originally made. I suppose it likely from your representation
there are two sets of returns in the office
