

a larger tract Surveyed to Samuel Metlin the 3rd day of November 1814 on his Warrant  
dated September the 1<sup>st</sup> 1814 and said to contain 170 A 22 perches. Resurveyed the above  
the 13<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1816 at the instance of Caleb Parker Esq<sup>r</sup> Adm<sup>r</sup> of Samuel  
Metlin Dec<sup>r</sup>.
