



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Macetawny Township in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania. Being Part of a Tract of 75 Acres formerly surveyed unto Andreas Fisher, But now to be confirmed unto his Son Anthony Fisher, who is to convey the above Part thereof unto Henry Metzstein. Beginning at a stone in a line of the said Henry Metzsteins other Land. Thence by the same North 80<sup>deg</sup> East 55<sup>1/2</sup> perches to a stone, a corner of the said Anthony Fisher's Land. Thence by the same South 9<sup>deg</sup> West 38<sup>1/2</sup> perches to a stone, and North 70<sup>deg</sup> East 22<sup>1/2</sup> perches to a stone, and North 3<sup>deg</sup> West 33 perches to a stone, and North 80<sup>deg</sup> East 86<sup>1/2</sup> perches to a stone, and South 10<sup>deg</sup> East 50 perches to a stone. Thence by the said Anthony Fisher's and by the said Henry Metzsteins other Land, South 80<sup>deg</sup> West 155<sup>1/2</sup> perches to a stone and North 10<sup>deg</sup> West 50 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Forty Two Acres and 144 perches of Land together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads.
