



A Draught of Two Tracts of Land Situate in Maxatawny Township in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania. Being Part of a Tract of 75 acres, formerly Surveyed unto Andreas Fisher, whereof about 14.2<sup>acres</sup> etc, are to be conveyed unto Henry Hartstein, and the above Two Parts thereof are to remain for his son Anthony Fisher.

The first Beginning at a stone in the line of John Hartmans Land. Thence by the same South 10<sup>deg</sup> East 50 perches to a stone. Thence by the same and by the said Anthony Fishers other Land, South 80<sup>deg</sup> West 99 perches to a stone. Thence by the said Henry Hartsteins Land North 10<sup>deg</sup> West 50 perches to a stone. Thence by the said Anthony Fishers other Land North 80 degrees East 99 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Twenty nine acres and 30 perches of Land with the usual allowance.

The Second Tract Beginning at a stone a Corner of the said Henry Hartsteins Land. Thence by the same South 3<sup>47</sup><sub>1</sub><sup>1</sup> East 33 perches to a stone, and South 70<sup>deg</sup> West 22<sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> perches to a stone, and North 9<sup>deg</sup> East 38<sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> perches to a stone, a corner of the said Anthony Fishers other Land. Thence by the same, North 80<sup>deg</sup> East 13<sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Three acres and 86 perches of Land, together with the usual allowance at six per cent for Roads.
