



Situate on the East side of Monongahela River in Elizabeth Township Allegheny County, And is part of a tract of land surveyed by Arch^d McClean by his Assistant Mr. Richard Backhouse on the 6th day of September 1769 in pursuance of an Order of Survey N^o 2237 dated 3^d April 1769 and a part of a quantity of land adjacent thereto then claimed by the said Robert Thompson and circumscribed by the said Backhouse with an intention to take a Warrant for the Surplus as appears by the entries in my office relative thereto - but Collo Benjamin Davis who has acted as an assistant for or to me in that part, being called upon by George Fokler to execute a Warrant which he had procured for part of the Surplus, was lead into the Survey of Robert Thompson as marked in the above plan (interference with the location of Robert Thompson 73 1/2 Acres) and was prevailed upon to add to the Survey of Robert Thompson 38 3/4^{all} as above represented. In doing of which he discovered an unaccountable error in the Survey of Backhouse, which has the effect of altering the original plan of survey in such degree as scarce to admit of a representation of similarity, the errors are hereby corrected and the parties concerned profess a desire to do Justice to the State by paying up the sum which would have been due had no error or interference happened.
