Situate on the East side of Monongahela River in Elizabeth Township Allegheny County and is intended to represent an Error in a former Survey made by Richard Backhouse then Assistant of Archibald McLean's Deputy Surveyor, also to set forth circumstances that have since happened.

Explanation: Coll: Benjamin Davis who is now present has discovered an Error in the Survey returned to Robert Thompson on Location #2237 whereby the figure or representation made by Backhouse is found to be very erroneous — Coll: Davis having been ignorant of the circumstances until lately has been lead by the Applicant to an encroachment on the right of Robert Thompson as represented by the lesser quadrangular figure which he has surveyed to George Tockler on a Warrant right in addition to the other lands of the said George Tockler as represented. And as said Backhouse had circumscribed more land than the right of Thompson by location as aforesaid could cover he took in 38<sup>9</sup>/<sub>4</sub> adjacent as represented. <sup>which</sup> will be found to be contained in the Original Survey of Thompson as circumscribed by Backhouse. — the parties concerned finding themselves in a hobble propose to compound with the State and pay the balance that would have been due on the whole had no interference taken place, it appears therefore that as 38<sup>9</sup>/<sub>4</sub> has been returned on the location right, without the limits of Thompsons Old Survey as returned by Virtue of the Location and 73<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> taken out by the Warrant of George Tockler that the difference ought to be paid to the State on the terms of the location which they are said to be willing to do.
