

The Small Triangle A is what Land is Disputed — I am Informed that when George Smith Run the Tract for Robert Hodgin in Running the line D he found he would run into Hodgins Fields when about half way, that he then moved off on a Right Angle, and again Took his Course which is the Occasion of the Dispute and is the Difference between the N.O. Grub, and the Post at F. 8 perches. — I Run the line D For the Variation of the Other lines which has Constituted the Above mentioned Triangle A. When Stines place was Surveyed the Marked Trees Guided in the Directions of the Dotted line, but by the Corners (as near as Could be Traced) and Running the Parallel, the Black line seems to be the Original. This was not known when Stines Survey was made

Resurveyed by the Original Lines the 5th day of September 1791 for Andrew Kline & Robert Hodgin in Pursuance of a Warrant to Robt Hodgin Dated the 14th Day of November 1741 Containing one Hundred and Eighty Three Acres & 55 perches & allorances
