



Situate in the River Susquehanna Called Bald Eagle Containing two acres and one quarter of an acre of Land and the usual allorance &c Surveyed In pursuance of a Warrant granted unto Sebastian Fick for about one acre and a half bearing date the sixteenth day of September A.D. 1802 the courses and distances of which are as follows. viz: Beginning at a lime stone Rock where this ^{Mark} is placed in the above Diagram thence Down the Susquehanna River North eighty one Degrees East eleven perches South forty five degrees and three quarters East nineteen perches and one tenth South twenty five degrees and three quarters east eighteen perches and seven tenths thence up the same on the south side and about ten Perches from Forge Island North eighty six degrees West fifteen Perches and nine tenth North forty nine degrees West thirteen perches and North thirty one degrees West sixteen perches and one quarter to the Place of Beginning Containing two acres and one quarters of an acre of Land and allorance &c as afores^d being opposite where John Haldeman lives and Eastward in the said River to an Island called Forge Island and about one mile from the mouth of Codorus Creek where it empties in to the said River Surveyed 6th December A.D. 1802 P.M.
