

By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed to James Rhoddy a Tract of Land in the Townships of Hempfield & Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak on the Barrens thence by Vacant Land & the Land of Thomas Brown North by West three hundred & ten perches to a hickory thence by Vacant Land West by South & W N E hundred & twenty-eight acres to a hickory thence by the Land of George Stewart ~~South East by South W N E~~ one hundred & thirty-three perches to a Black Oak thence continuing by the ~~South East by South W N E~~ ^{forty-one} perches to a post thence by the Land of John Cook South fifteen deg. ^{a half} East One hundred & ^{forty-one} perches to a Black Oak thence East by South fifty-eight perches to a White Oak thence by Vacant Barrens East by North One hundred forty-one perches to the place of Beginning Containing Three Hundred & fifty seven acres with the usual allowance
