

Draught of a Survey made Feb. 24. 1842 in pursuance of an Order from the Board of Property granted to Moses Dunbar, sole surviving Executor of the Estate of John Dunbar, dec'd) dated the 23<sup>d</sup> of Feb. 1826 directing a Resurvey so as to include any vacant land that may be found adjoining land Surveyed on a Warrant granted to the said John Dunbar, the 27<sup>d</sup> of June 1788. Then in Westmoreland County, now Wilkins Township, Allegheny County, and Waters of Turtle Creek. Containing One Hundred and Seventy five acres thirty-four 9/10 perches and allorance of six percent.
