


The above 100rd was laid out to Jacob Baker

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty Second Day of October A.D.
1735 Surveyed unto Jacob Baker A Certain Tract of Land situated in Heidelberg Township on a Branch of
Tulpehocken Creek called the Mill Creek adjoining to the Land of Mich^l Breith Beginning at a large
Chesnut Tree marked at a Corner of said Breith's Land Thence extending by said Baker's other Land North one
hundred pches & three Quarters to a black oak standing Thence West by Vacant Land one hundred & Sixty pches
to a small black oak Thence South by Vacant Land one hundred ten pches and three Quarters to a marked
white Oak in a Line of said Breith's Land Thence by same East eighty-four pches to a black oak marked
North ten pches to a small Hickory marked and East seventy six pches to the place of Beginning.
Containing One hundred Acres and the usual Allowance for Roads to be Surveyed y^e 26th Day of
October A.D. 1735
