



Situate in Fawn Township York County and Maryland being on both sides of the Province line surveyed on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1771 In Pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1770. on Trial between Robert Gordon and Walter Robinson, wherein Robinson is allowed to have 42<sup>a</sup> between the old Temporary Line and new Province Line, which Quantity is Contained between the Temporary Line and the dotted line and 3<sup>a</sup> & 113 pfs Between the dotted line and new Province line, the dotted line is agreeable to Gordens mind, but not so to Robinson, as he wants to follow the Province line along and then strike a line across so as to leave Gordens 3<sup>a</sup> & 113 perches on the 5 10<sup>1/2</sup> E line.

Mathews late D.S. as he Mr Cooper does not wish to go to the expense of a Resurvey. The whole being examined, Calculated and Corrected the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1803.
