



I hereby certify that I have resurveyed to John Heyers a certain tract of land in the Township of Concord in the County of Delaware (formerly Chester) containing 25 Acres being a part of a tract of 200 Acres originally Surveyed to Andrew Mackleron by virtue of a Warrant from William Penn Proprietary & Governor of the Province of Pennsylvania & the Territories thereto belonging, dated at Chester the 6th of the 12th mo 1682 and directed to Thomas Holmes Surveyor Genl: Beginning at a White oak in Concord Cross Street at a corner of land late of James Hayward (now of Dockett &c. Gamble) thence North twenty five degrees West by the same land Sixty six perches to a small Hickory, thence North Sixty six degrees East by land late of Morgan Jones (now of the said John Heyers) forty six perches to a Stake by a run (where there formerly stood a Gunn tree) thence down the said run South East, ten perches, & South Sixty six degrees East forty perches to a Stake, formerly an ash, thence South Twenty four degrees East by the tract aforesaid twenty five perches to a Spanish oak, thence South Sixty six degrees West along the said Cross Street by the land late of Daniel Stubbs & John Palmer now of Charles Barrett & Joseph Palmer Seventy two perches to the place of beginning containing Twenty five acres; which is in the possession of the said John Heyers, Signed
